

HARVEST FARMS



Harvest Farmer, Ross DeOtte, is the heartbeat of the Harvest gardens. He loves connecting with Harvest neighbors and helping them be successful in their gardens. Farmer Ross also does a number of educational classes and events throughout the year. From seminars, Harvest Sprouts, gardening series, to school field trips, Scout events, and spring planting, Farmer Ross takes an active role educating the next generation of farmers. He provides opportunities for

neighbors to get in the dirt and grow something so they can develop a love of gardening. An example of how he provides hands on learning was a salsa making class. He taught residents how to harvest the ingredients and how to create a fresh, healthy salsa.

Farmer Ross launched a Harvest Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program in 2018. It has continued to evolve and grow to be a community favorite. Our CSA is a subscription that provides locally grown produce to our neighbors on a weekly basis. Farmer Ross includes his own produce as well as produce and other items from other local farmers. This is a great program and helps us as we deepen the roots of Harvest gardens and the importance of supporting local agriculture.







HARVEST MASTERS 50+



Harvest Masters are those 50+. It's a flourishing group that help neighbors in this stage of life find community. This group has brought healing for widows, friends for the

lonely, and a social outlet for those who feel out of place with all of the young families in Harvest. They gather multiple times a month – formally and informally. Harvest Teens & Nike #HARVESTSWOOSH

The Harvest Teen Council was started in 2016 to engage teens to take ownership and leadership in their community. They plan activities that interest them, serve those in need by helping raise funds for the North Texas Food Bank, connect with other teens in the neighborhood, and help raise up the next generation of leaders by assisting the junior members. They hold four philanthropic events per year (e.g., Hoops for Hunger, summer peanut butter drive, Halloween Zombie Hunt). This year, they raised enough money to donate more than 5,000 meals to the North Texas Food Bank!

Last year, our teens developed a partnership with Nike at Tanger Outlets. They are Nike Community Ambassadors and work alongside Nike athletes to encourage young children to get moving. They hosted several Nike camps this year with more than 100 kids in attendance, as well as participated in a big Nike camp in Dallas. It's been a great partnership and has inspired our teens.

We partnered with the PTA's from both schools on the Harvest Annual Turkey Trot. The PTA's promoted the race, sold concessions and school merch, as well as hosted a canned food drive. Their efforts resulted in more than 6,500 pounds of food being donated to the North Texas Food Bank!!

HARVEST PROVIDES MORE THAN 48,000 MEALS TO THE

NORTH TEXAS FOOD BANK IN 2019

In so many ways, gardening nourishes the soul of our community. Our theme is living a bountiful life which also means sharing our bounty with those in need. Since our first residents moved here in 2014, our community has donated more than 110,733 meals to the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB) and its partners. In 2019, Harvest residents have donated more than 48,104 meals! Something the food bank lacks is fresh produce. Because of our community farm and garden plots, we were able to provide more than 1,900 pounds of fresh produce. We are so proud of this accomplishment! Through the community garden plots, our demonstration garden, and special events, our residents are fighting hunger in North Texas.

Polar Bear Plunge

The annual Polar Plunge where residents jumped in to the pool resulted **450 meals** (January)

Hoops for Hunger

Harvest Teen Council provides **1,380 meals** to the NTFB. (March)

Peanut Butter Drive

Homeowners donated 175 pounds of peanut butter for the NTFB, which equates to **210** meals (lune)

NTFB Plots

Homeowners harvested 692 pounds of produce for the NTFB, which equates to 830 meals. (January - December)

Farmer Ross donated 1,126 pounds of produce from the demonstration garden, which equates to **1,351 meals**.

Back to School Party

Harvest Teen Council raised \$175 for the NTFB which equates to **620 meals.** (August)

Turkey Trot

The annual Turkey Trot resulted in \$4,254 for the NTFB. The donation was matched and provided **25,524 meals**. (November)

Harvest Area 51 (Halloween)

Harvest Teen Council raised \$225, which equates to **1,530 meals**. (October)

Facebook Campaign

We held a Facebook Giving Campaign on North Texas Giving Day - \$255 was donated which equates to **1,530 meals**. (December)

Argyle West Elementary (Canned Food Drive

In support of the Turkey Trot, the school held a canned food drive for the North Texas Food Bank and donated 6,500 pounds! That equates to **7,800 meals**.
