



Outdoor Community Grills Guidelines

The outdoor community grills intended for the enjoyment of Harvest homeowners and their guests. As with all of the amenities, the upkeep and maintenance is funded by HOA dues, so please be responsible.

Outdoor Community Grill use:

- Use at your own risk
- Abide by Denton County rules, see below and website
- Do not burn un-approved material (i.e. yard waste, brush, lumber)
- Please clean grate after use, these are in a shared space so leave it better than you found it.
- Do not put ashes in trash containers, leave in lower area and allow to completely cool
- Only use charcoal
- Have a water source or extinguisher available in case of emergency

Never, ever leave the grill unattended. This is the cardinal safety rule of grilling. All it takes is one good breeze to blow ashes out of the grill and onto the ground, nearby furniture, etc. If you have to step away for a moment designate another person to keep an eye on the grill.

Denton County Burn Regulations

Outdoor burning is allowed when used solely for recreational or ceremonial purposes, in the noncommercial preparation of food, or exclusively as a means to provide warmth in cold weather. In other words, campfires, and cooking fires are allowed. Fires built under this exception may not contain domestic waste, electrical insulation, treated lumber, plastics, construction or demolition materials not made of wood, heavy oils, asphaltic materials, potentially explosive materials, chemical wastes, or items containing natural or synthetic rubber.
