YOU CARE FOR THE CAREGIVERS

Tony and Magie have been lovingly taking care of each other for the past 14 years – and they're grateful for friends like you who help care for them both when there's little room left in the budget for nutritious food.

"This is a great supplement, more of a lifeline," Tony

says on a visit to the Neighborhood Needs Food Pantry in Fort Worth, a TAFB Partner Agency.

Tony, 67, retired 17 years ago from work in home construction after being diagnosed with arthritis that left him in too much pain to continue working.

Magie, 65, is currently in remission from throat cancer. Both Magie and Tony now rely on Social Security disability income to pay for monthly expenses.

"Social Security is not a whole lot of money with rent," Tony says.

Thankfully, the couple can pick up plenty of nutritious food at Neighborhood Needs. They have visited the food pantry since receiving Magie’s cancer diagnosis.

“These places help,” she says.

Magie says she and Tony would have to live with the bare minimum if it weren’t for the food they receive from the food pantry — and right now nutritious food is especially essential for Magie’s continued recovery.
